

The Video Clip Geniuses

This year the Annecy International Animation Film Festival puts **music videos** centre stage with **"The Video Clip Geniuses"**, 5 programmes of video clips interspersed or followed by discussions with some of the creators and leading studios that have contributed to animation film's more recent history: **Michel Gondry, Raman Djafari, Steve Cutts, Victor Haegelin, Jérôme Combe and Fortiche** as well as a programme dedicated to Hungarian music videos.

"Our programmes dedicated to the Video Clip Geniuses will allow us to meet some extraordinary creators including Michel Gondry, a magician with images, Raman Djarfari, designer of the vibrant Annecy 2025 official poster, Englishman Steve Cutts, Frenchman Victor Haegelin, and Jérôme Combe, one of the key creators of the Arcane series. A programme of Hungarian music videos, curated by Maud Ahmadnia, will tie this year's Festival themes together."

A visionary artist and a real wizard with images, **Michel Gondry** has transformed the world of music videos through his work with artists such as Björk, The White Stripes, Steriogram and Daft Punk. For Marcel Jean, the Festival's Artistic Director, "Michel Gondry assumes the legacy both of Georges Méliès and Norman McLaren. His abundant creativity and innovative approach have brought hand-crafted animation back into the mainstream — as brilliantly illustrated by The Science of Sleep." While Eternal Sunshine of the Spotless Mind immediately became a cult film and Is the Man Who Is Tall Happy?: An Animated Conversation with Noam Chomsky was awarded the Prix André-Martin for best French

animated feature in 2014, Annecy has never had the pleasure of welcoming Michel Gondry. The Annecy Festival 2025, which will highlight the links between animation and music videos, will offer a journey into the heart of the creative process of the director who brought us *Maya*, *Give Me a Title*. The visit will be an opportunity for the Festival to present him with an Honorary Cristal, in recognition of his exceptional contribution to the vibrancy of animation.

Famous for his scathing take on society and his collaboration with Moby, Steve Cutts won an award at the 2018 Annecy Festival for his music video *Are You Lost in the World Like Me?* He will be at Annecy for the first time this year and will be presenting an exclusive Making of on his captivating universe.

Raman Djafari, who designed the swirling, multi-coloured poster for the 2025 Festival, made a name for themselves with their baroque, queer and ever-surprising music videos, such as the spectacular *Traveler* for Lucky Chops, co-directed with Daniel Almagor and an award-winner at the Annecy Festival in 2020.

Raman Djafari is an illustrator, animator and filmmaker working in both 2D and 3D and currently living in Berlin, Germany. Through poetic imagery and fragmented narratives, they hope to reach into a realm of honest emotionality, creating surreal worlds and characters that oscillate between the familiar and the fantastical. Raman has directed music videos for artists from across the globe, like Elton John, Dua Lipa, Coldplay and Ashnikko, as well as having worked with clients like Adult Swim, Spotify and *The New Yorker*. The London-based production studio Blinkink currently acts as Raman Djafari's representative as a filmmaker.



Victor Haegelin

Victor Haegelin discovered cinema, and animation in particular, during his studies at the FAMU Prague film school. Inspired by Eastern European animation masters such as Jan Švankmajer and Jiři Trnka, Victor decided to teach himself stop motion. He began his career by directing a film for Radio Nova, which was subsequently an award-winner. Since then, he has directed stop-motion films for Wax Tailor, Caravan Palace, McDonalds, KitKat, Lego, Daily Mirror, Nestlé, Disney, Galeries Lafayette and Berluti, to name but a few. Victor loves bringing everyday objects to life. He considers himself to be the fastest animator in Paris and is working on being the fastest in France! Jérôme Combe, Co-Founder of Fortiche Production, is behind the visual style of the *Arcane* series. An industrial design graduate, he began teaching himself about 3D animation in 1991. He then worked as a director of photography and character designer in video games, while directing awardwinning music videos (including *Respire* by Mickey 3D, which won the 2004 Victoire de la musique award), and advertising for Nexus London. By collaborating with Pascal Charrue and Arnaud Delord, together they founded Fortiche Production, a Paris-based studio renowned for its hybrid 2D/3D style and its partnerships with Ubisoft, Carbine Studios and Riot Games. Spotted by Riot in 2012 after seeing the *La Gaviota* video, they began a long-term collaboration, which continued with *Get Jinxed* (2013) and the Emmy-winning *Arcane* series (2021).
